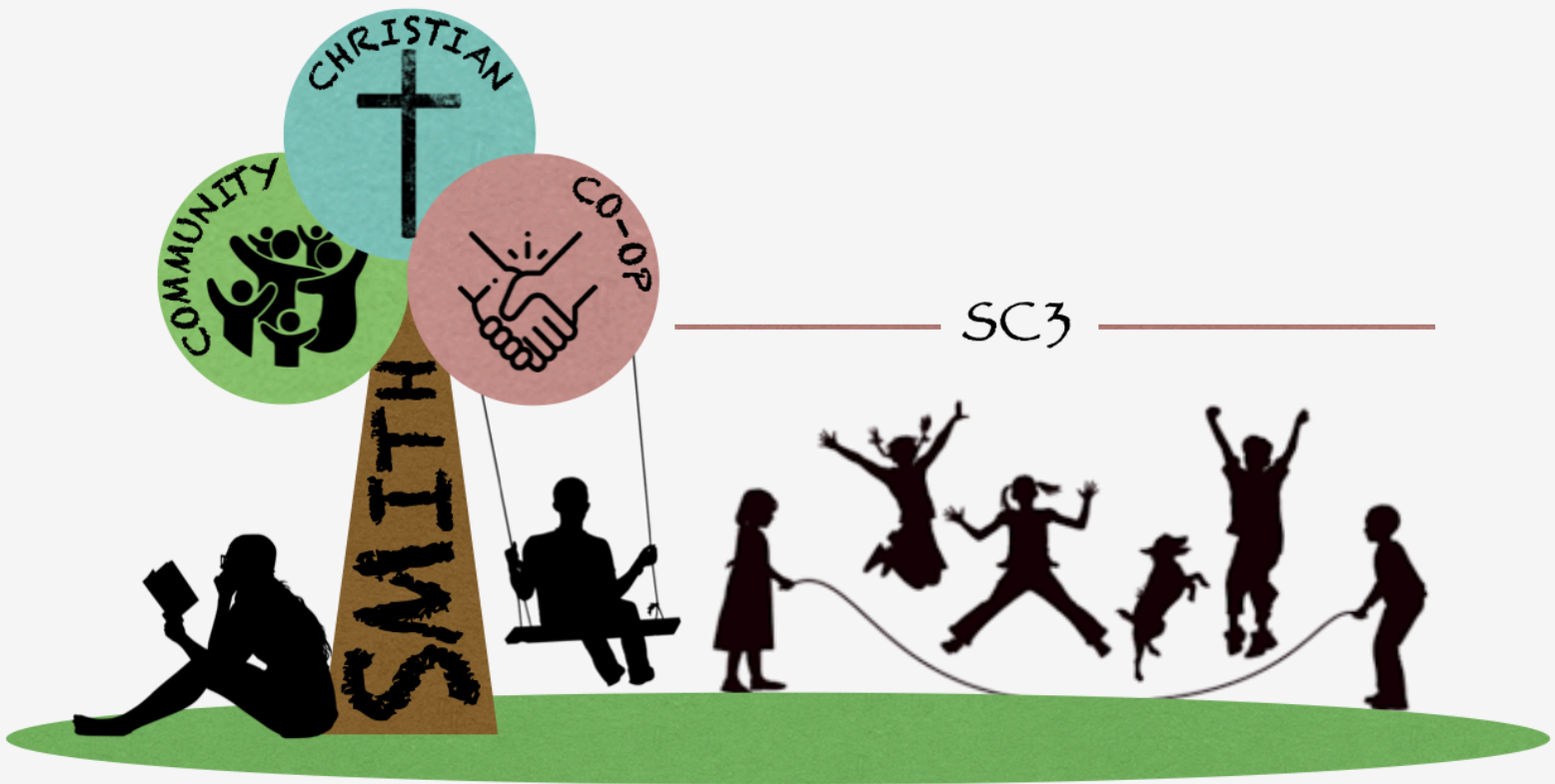

Fall 2021 Meeting Location & Fees**

Meeting Days, Times, Location - For the Fall 2021 Semester, classes will be held from 8:30am through 3pm on Mondays beginning August 16 and concluding on December 13. Classes will be held at First Baptist Church in Gordonsville, TN located at 70 E. Main St.

Application/Registration Fee - Each family is responsible for a yearly application fee of **\$ 15 per household** to be paid each fall in addition to registration fees for each participating child. Registration fees are paid per semester and are as follows: **\$15 for sibling 1, \$10 for sibling 2, \$10 for sibling 3, \$5 for sibling 4** and for families with more than 4 children there is no additional fee to register additional siblings. (See chart.)

These application and registration fees will be used to cover insurance costs and, therefore, must be paid in full at least one week prior to the start of classes so that we can have insurance in place before the first day of classes.

Monthly Tuition - Because of the incredible community of parents we have volunteering in our co-op and the generous hospitality of FBC Gordonsville, we are able to offer classes at no cost to our students. *In lieu of monthly tuition, we would like to return a blessing to the church by collecting canned goods to donate to their food ministry on the first Monday of every month.* At a minimum, we ask each student to bring at least two canned goods on the first Monday of each month. Canned goods will be collected at the welcome table in the gym as students arrive.

Supply Fees - There may be a small one-time fee per student for some classes that require supplies. Those fees are due on the first day of classes and should be given directly to the teaching parent. Families who did not pay class supply fees in the previous semester will be required to pay those fees before their child(ren) can attend the following semester.

Drop-Off Option - At SC3, we place heavy emphasis on parent involvement and recognize parent participation as the fundamental factor that allows us to offer classes at no cost to our members. At the same time, we also understand that as children become older and more independent, many parents find that they prefer a tutorial setting over a co-op. For this reason, we do allow a drop-off option *for parents of students in grades 9-12 only* who are unable to remain on campus for the day. The cost for this drop-off option is an additional **\$25 per student per semester**. Parents who wish to participate in the drop-off option must indicate so at the time of registration, sign a student drop-off waiver co-signed by another on-site parent (of your choice) who is willing to assume guardianship of your child while you are away, and provide two emergency contacts. The drop-off option fee is due no later than the first day of classes for each semester. We are unable to accept students younger than 9th grade into our drop off program.

Inclement Weather - When inclement weather is forecast, be sure to check your email and the co-op Facebook page before heading to meetings. We will follow Smith County School closings and have already factored in a weather related make-up day. (Our second semester is 19 weeks instead of 18.)

Missing Mondays due to illness or other reasons - Students who are not enrolled in the drop off program MAY NOT attend co-op without a parent. In the event that you are unable to attend co-op on Mondays, please keep your children home with you until you are able to return.

Smith Community Christian Co-Op (SC3) Fall 2021 Member Expectations & Guidelines

Non-Teaching Parent Expectations - We understand that not everyone feels led to teach, but we do encourage all co-op parents to actively participate in some manner. Ideally, no classroom should be without two adult volunteers at any time. Non-teaching parents are expected to fill in as needed and duties may include: greeting students and parents, being a teacher helper, volunteering to monitor the halls, monitoring the lunchroom, helping in the nursery, and participating in clean up at the end of the day. We will do our best to accommodate parent preferences and ask that you indicate your preferences on your application. Parents are expected to be either in a class as a helper or “on call” as a backup sub unless it is their “free” hour. All volunteer parents are required to have a free hour to rest and visit with other parents.

Teaching Parent Expectations - Teaching parents are expected to provide well thought out and engaging lessons, arrive on time, and maintain order in their classes at all times. If an assistant is needed, it is the responsibility of the teaching parent to let their coordinator know. If assistants are limited on any specific date, preference will go to the class that has the most students.

Please understand that our teaching parents are volunteers who may or may not have a specialization in the area they are teaching. We ask that all parents show respect for the effort our volunteer teachers give to make this co-op run smoothly and efficiently at minimal costs. Please extend grace on days where classes may not have gone as planned and consider sharing a word of encouragement on days when your children come home excited about what they learned or did in class. To echo the Apostle Paul in 1 Thessalonians 5, “Therefore encourage one another and build one another up!”

Attendance - Students are expected to attend classes regularly unless providentially hindered (travel, illness, emergency, etc.) Our teachers go to great lengths to prepare lessons for their classes, so please appreciate their efforts by attending as regularly as possible. Likewise, others are depending on you to show up and help the co-op run as organized and smoothly as planned.

Grades - Our classes are designed to supplement the education provided by parents to their children. Parents have the sole responsibility for assigning credits and grades for classes and maintain all responsibility for their children’s education. Parents may ask their child’s class teacher for input when deciding their grades, but our volunteer parents cannot assume responsibility for record keeping of grades.

Smith Community Christian Co-Op (SC3) Student Member Code of Conduct

SC3 supports the efforts of our families to bring up their children “in the way that they should go.” We are committed to nurturing an environment of respect for one another through honesty, kindness, patience, understanding and care. We have developed a list of guidelines to help students know what is expected of them at SC3 and help them have successful experiences. Please go over these guidelines with your student thoroughly.

1. Be respectful and obedient during the day. This includes respecting the teachers, volunteers, and any other adult, students, and property.

2. Come prepared to class as requested by your teachers.

- Bring all needed supplies.
- Homework should be completed neatly and on time.

3. Refrain From Leaving a Class When Class is in Session.

- No one should be in the hall for any reason between classes.
- Requests to leave class should be only in emergencies. Please make every effort to use the restroom between classes.

4. Dress Code: As a Christian community, we seek to provide a fun, exciting learning environment that is free from distraction or temptation. For this reason, we strongly advise students to dress modestly:

- Shorts or skirts shorter than the tip of the middle finger when arms are relaxed to the sides are not permitted. Form-fitting (i.e. leggings or running tights) must be worn with shirts that meet the short/skirt length guideline.
- Tops must cover areas from shoulder to shoulder, armpit to armpit, and must completely cover the midsection (No crop tops, spaghetti tanks).
- Pants must be worn at the waist.
- Shoes must be worn at all times and should be safe for the school environment. Black soled shoes are not permitted on the gym floor.
- Clothing may not depict, imply, advertise, or advocate illegal, violent, or lewd conduct, weapons, alcohol, tobacco, marijuana, or other controlled substances.
- Clothing may not display offensive or inappropriate language or images.

5. Bring only items needed in class to co-op.

- Leave all distracting toys at home.
- Cell phones should not be used in class at any time unless specifically permitted by the teaching parent. Phones that are distracting class will be collected and returned to the on-site parent or at the end of the day for drop-off students.
- Weapons of any kind toy or otherwise are not permitted (this includes pocket knives.)

6. Clean up after yourself.

- Place all trash in proper containers.
- Leave all rooms better than you found them.

7. Follow all rules set by the hosting church.

- No running in hallways.
- Use inside voices while inside the building.
- The playground area is reserved for children up through 4th grade with adult supervision.

8. Food, including lunch, must be eaten only in designated rooms. No food or drink is allowed in classrooms except as part of planned educational activities.

9. Students are not allowed outside without an adult. There is to be no loitering in the parking lot, no sitting in cars, and no wandering around the building, inside or out.

Disciplinary Policy

Violations of the Student Code of Conduct could result in the following disciplinary actions: a verbal warning, removal from class, asking parents to attend class with the student, or in extreme cases, dismissal from SC3.

Homework Preparation Expectations

Our teaching parents offer rich courses with great opportunities for learning. For our older students, homework may be assigned. This is an integral part of the education process. If your students are not prepared for class, it is a hindrance not only to your student's learning process but also to the entire class, who is now ahead of your student. Please encourage your child to participate in all homework activities.

CLASS DESCRIPTION LIST

We are very excited about the classes we have to offer as we begin our second school year together as a Co-op! Please read over the class descriptions and (where applicable) indicate on your class registration form which classes you would prefer your student to take. Unless your student is in high school, if you wish for your child not to participate in a specific class, *the only other available option is for them to sit with you*, their parent, during that block of instruction. High School Students who do not wish to take certain courses can volunteer to assist in one of the yellow or orange group classes - class choice for helpers will be on a first come, first serve basis and there is a limit of one high school helper per class. ***Students must remain on campus for the entire day unless they become sick or have an emergency.*** We cannot allow students to come and go sporadically throughout the day, arriving late and leaving early. Arrival is 8:30 and dismissal is at 3.

Preschool & Nursery Classes (RED GROUP)
